

Paul asked for someone to do the Clinic in for November meeting. Louis thought that we had one planned but will check his minutes.


Joe Robertson, MMR was asked if there were any awards to be presented there were none.

Turkey Creek Achievement Program Launch **Master Builder- Cars**

This program was started by Paul Richardson, MMR. It was program that he had done in Texas in the Lone Star Division. It was done to get members interested in becoming MMR's.

He has asked if the were any members of the Turkey Creek Division who were interest in doing this. There were about 6 who said ves. Paul also said that he would provide a list of materials that would be e-mailed to the group and also put out on the web site for Turkey Creek. At the October

meeting he found one of the members who would host the first meeting of this group. We set the date as the 28th of October on Saturday afternoon at 1pm. We would meet at Brad Morneau's home in Stanley, KS.

We had the following attendees: Charles Heying, Scott Miros, Louis Seibel, Brad Morneau and Paul Richardson, MMR.



Paul explained what we going to do and what you have to build for your AP certificate. You must scratch build 4 cars and super detail 4 additional cars. One of these cars needs to be some type of passenger car. You must have 4



cars judged and receive a merit award of at least 87 1/2 points on them. He showed what tools you should have to build these cars using either wood or plastic. Some of these tools include a Chopper for making straight cuts in the material, he also had a chopper on which you could adjust the angle of the cut, an assortment of extra #10 blades, single edge razor blades, metal or nail files, a paint brush for putting on the glue, some type of holder for the bottle of glue(so that it will not spill). He used a sponge and cut a hole in the middle to set the glue in. Another very important item is a scale ruler. Everything you build has to be done in the scale that you are building in. Also a good pair of calipers would help in duplicating parts. He said that Pro-Weld or Tenex-7 are very good solvents. You only use a small amount on the edges. He said that we could build flat cars for the four different cars. That we would need to put ends, sides, to make the different cars but all would come from the original flat car



Some of us had to leave and would complete the car at home.

Below is the list of parts that you needed for the clinic:

1.030 styrene sheet for floor and sides 1.010 styrene sheet

Package of 080x .125 or .080x.100 styrene strips

1pk. Grandt Line brake detail set

Scribed siding for deck (wood or styrene)

1pk. Grandt Line stake pockets

1pk. Grandt Line Stirrups

1 pair trucks and screws to mount them

1 pair of couplers (your choice)

Paint (your choice) Decals (your choice) 1 load (your choice) Styrene solvent Ambroid Pro-Weld or Tenex Note: Ambroid Pro-weld comes with an applicator brush in the cap - Tenex does not

More techniques will follow in future sessions. I hope that more of you get involved in the AP, it is a great way to improve your skills and pass on the knowledge that you have gained to a new model railroader down the line.

7. Layout Tour


















Saw-By at Squealer Siding

I thought some of you might enjoy trying your hand at a switching problem the train crews sometimes run into on the Frisco & White River RR. Give it a try, then compare your solution to one found elsewhere in the newsletter.

Here's the story. Ned Kneadler, dispatcher, has scheduled the Southbound out of Bear Creek Springs to meet the Northbound out of Compton on the single track at Capps, Arkansas. The single switch siding at Capps Iknown as Squealer because it serves Squealer Feeds] is only 112' long and will hold only 2 freight cars or 1 engine. Each train has an engine and four freight cars, and are too long to fit into the siding. Vernon Shanks, engineer on the morning Southbound, is in charge of a maneuver known as a saw-by, a series of moves which will allow the two trains to get around each other and continue on their routes.

> How many moves will it take you to get both trains past each other? The siding will only hold two cars OR one engine at a time. Each direction change of either engine counts as a move. When complete, each train must be headed with it's original engine. Get your best score then compare your solution to Vernon's.

Saw-By at Squealer Siding How Vernon Shanks got her done. Fig 1 North N= Northbound South S= Southbound

1] N backs two train lengths south of the siding 2] S uncouples from its train and moves south past the switch 3] S backs into the siding

4] N heads north, clears the switch, couples to first two S cars

5] S heads south two train lengths beyond

6] N backs past spur with two cars from S


7] N spots the two S cars on siding

8] N backs out of siding

9] N heads north past switch and couples to

10] S backs onto siding and couples to cars
