

## Clinic For September 26, 2006 "Scale Color" By Jim EuDaly

A career as an optometrist made me aware of color vision characteristics and this clinic is an attempt to understand "scale color" and apply the knowledge to our modeling efforts. Items such as light intensity, color temperature, size and distance and other factors will be discussed and illustrated with slides. Formulas for modifying colors will be presented for the common modeling scales and a handout containing a synopsis of the clinic will be available.





## Turkey Creek 2006 Layout Tour

I am very happy to report that this year's 2006 Turkey Creek Division Meet Layout Tour was a smashing success. First, we had 9 layouts volunteered for the tour. Second, we had a good turnout reported at all layouts. No layouts this year reported that they had no visitors, or only a small number of visitors, even though we had several that were 25 miles or more from the convention center where the actual divisional meet and train show was held. As expected, the layouts that were the closest to the convention center had the heaviest traffic, but even the outlying layouts in Kansas City, Kansas and in Missouri reported 20 or more visitors.

The tour was divided into two groupings. The first was the afternoon tour which lasted from 3 until 6 pm. There were five different layouts in this group. Three were within three miles of the convention center, the fourth was about six and a half miles and the last was in Kansas City, Kansas and was sixteen miles away. The second grouping was the evening tour which was held from 6 until 9 pm. There were four layouts in this tour and all were in Missouri. They averaged 25 miles from the convention center.

The layout descriptions follow. The first five were in the afternoon tour. The last four were the evening tour. Each layout will have a description followed by one or two pictures.

#### San Juan Mountain Layout by Shelley Levy



Description:

A free-lance On3 layout sited in the San Juan Mountains of Colorado in the 1930/1940 era. The layout is in a 20'x40' room. About half of the full layout is in place and permits operating sessions. The portion that is in place is fully scenic'd except for a recent expansion which is partially scenic'd. Visible track is hand laid code 83



whereas hidden trackage is flextrack. Pictures by Louis Seibel

The power system is DCC (Easy DCC), the switch points are thrown using Tortise machines. A new control panel for the Westcliffe area uses a microcomputer chip and surface mount LED's (1/32" x 1/16") for non-glare operation when at night illumination. The campfire in the hobo camp uses fiber optics to simulate the brightness and ebbing of the burning fuel in the fire. Two buildings in the town of Tellurton, a mercantile and a feed store, have finished interiors.

#### Gold Mining and Milling in the Colorado Rockies by Ron Morse

#### Description:

The Forks Creek & Central Railroad has been under construction since 1984 and is 99.9% complete. It is basically an around the wall layout that contains two continuous loops. The FC&CRR is standard gauge and the Coyote Gold Tram narrow gauge HON2½. The layout is set in the turn of the century era in the Colorado Rockies during the fall of the year. The primary theme of the railroad is gold mining and milling with most of the motive power being geared steam locomotives. This layout was featured in the June, 1998 Model Railroader Magazine and the May/June 1998 NG&SL Gazette. A photo of the Coyote Gold Tram was featured on page 95 of the February 2003 Model Railroader Magazine. The backdrop for this railroad was hand painted by Ron which includes rounded corners, special lighting, fascia, and drapes. The layout abounds with animation. Ron is a Master Model Railroader (MMR-159) who has been published numerous times in the Model Railroad Press. Ron and his wife Vicki own and operate Morse Productions (a company which has produced model railroad detail parts since 1985). Also on display is one of the few surviving modules of the 'G' scale (1/24=GN42) Gold Creek Railroad (see Model Railroader Magazine, May 1998) which includes the Morse Mercantile (see Model Railroader Magazine, May 2002). 
## Chicago to Indiana by Joesph A. Ringbauer



## 2006 Turkey Creek Contest

If you did not get an opportunity to visit this year's contest room, you missed one of the best turnouts in a good long while. There were a total of eighty-one entries and every category was represented. Merit judging was requested for eleven entries and eight of those eleven entries received merit awards. That is over 70%, which is very good and a bit surprising. The overall quality of the entries was excellent, as well they should have been since the Greater Kansas City Area is blessed with some of the best modelers in the hobby. This year's meet also brought to the contest room two very good modelers from out of town, Lind Wickersham from Tulsa, Oklahoma and Earl Mullins from Hastings, Nebraska. 


