

As each variety of tree bloomed it amazed me the individual shape that is characteristic of each species. My thoughts drifted to our thoughts about animation. It is beyond my imagination even with today's computers to think that we could further enhance realities we have with DCC for engine control of a trains speed, direction, lights, the spectrum of train and ambient sounds, uncoupling, hump-yard operations and many more features that animation with a fast clock is totally pie in the sky. Yet there is another aspect of tree modeling. Deciduous trees are easily distinguished fro conifers with even the lowest quality of tree we place on the layout. We are blessed to live in this area were the seasons provide such viewing variety of nature. These thoughts brought back items published by the NMRA in the 50's. Yep, three score years ago our NMRA published Data sheets that had all kinds of 'good stuff'. I got out my old manual and thought about Ron Morse's guiding words "make the scene." Well this spring looking at the different shapes of a Bradford Pear or a dogwood has rekindled my desire for more reality in making and/or modifying trees to fit the scene.

Although today there are many more books and magazine articles to help us model the clarity, succinctness and visual examples stand out in the NMRA's help to modelers. Two pages of NMRA Data Sheets, No. 2Da and 2Da.05, are shown on pages 4 And 5 of this issue of the Lightning Slinger. I will bring my copy of the NMRA Data Sheets to the meeting. If there is sufficient desire by Division members other Data Sheets could be reprinted in future issues of the LS.

This month's clinician is Ron Morse presenting Creating Paper Buildings from Photos. His work has produced some of the most realistic buildings I've seen on a layout. You will not want to miss his clinic as it may also excite you about other ways to use photos in your modeling.

TREES AND SHRUBS

Trees and shrubs are either EVERGREEN, which keep their foliage the year around or DECIDUOUS, which lose their foliage each winter. Unless disturbed after considerable growth has occurred as in a bank washed away by water, trees tend to grow so that the weight of their trunk and larger limbs are balanced over the point where the trunk enters the ground and joins the roots. Models of trees constructed and set in such balanced manner will appear natural.

The examples of form and notes on color given below are representative of the various types that model builders can use to advantage, not only in constructing trees but in painting background scenery as well.



Hobby product prices could rise with China labor shortage

In a country of nearly 2 billion people, one would never expect China to have a labor shortage. And yet, it's experiencing one, though not exactly for a lack of people.

That means the cost of products sourced from there — including many hobby items —will be going up.

According to a variety of news sources, many Chinese manufacturing centers are competing for workers right now with higher pay and improved production environments. Firms there typically lose 10% of migrant workers following the annual Lunar New Year festival, however, this year companies are reporting that figure to be much higher — in some cases as much as 40%. This is happening as demand is increasing for products.

According to the *New York Times*, wages have risen as much as 20% in recent months, and in some isolated cases, workers are making as much as 40% than they were when the economic downturn started two years ago. Some Pearl River Delta manufacturers (Guandong-Shenzen area) are offering bonuses for signing as well as recommending relatives for employment.

The increased costs, ultimately, will have to be passed on to the global market. The biggest reason for workers not returning to the coastal manufacturing areas is the jobs being created in the interior of the country thanks to a \$500 billion government stimulus program. This is enabling the labor force to find jobs closer to home. Also contributing is what economists see as a long-term trend: China has drained its once vast reserves of unemployed workers in rural areas and is running out of fresh laborers for its factories, the *Times* says.





Here we go again! For the 7th Annual TCD Modeling Challenge, the theme continues, as it was the last two years, to be opened up to the max! Again this year, you may build and enter anything, yes....that's anything. The only requirement is that it must fit through the meeting room door! This is the theme voted on by the members attending the modeling challenge meeting last summer. We had some great entries then, with a range of small models to huge layout modules (barely fit through the door). As an added wrinkle, this year we will have an added category for Best Animation... small motors were made available at the January TC meeting.

So, what exactly does this mean for each of you? What it means is that you will not have any excuse whatsoever for not participating in the event. Let me emphasize here that the Modeling Challenge program was conceived to encourage everyone to participate in the enjoyment of building and displaying railroad models!! Please don't feel overwhelmed, intimidated, or that you don't have time to join in. It is hoped that by participating you will feel a sense of "inclusion", that of being "one of the group."

You may ask yourself, what sort of model could I enter? First, let me make this clarification.....entries need not be constructed especially for this event. If you have something that you built in the past, please consider entering it. Or, if there is a new project that you have been thinking about starting, now is a good time. You could limit your entry to a single car or locomotive..... remember any scale or gauge is acceptable, from Z to live steam. You could also consider entering your favorite entire train. Alternatively, you could focus on structures and enter a single structure or a full scene with several buildings. Remember, there is no limit! You might want to build a large or small display or diorama, with basic details or highly detailed. Whichever, this could be an opportunity to build a component of your home layout....to be incorporated into the layout at a later date. Several of the past entries have been used in this way, to a great benefit of the modeler. Possibly, the ultimate entry could be an entire operating layout (albeit, somewhat small..... remember, it has to fit through the door)! This is intended to be a fun filled event, with the entry possibilities only limited by your imagination, creativity, and enthusiasm to participate.

The judging will be by popular vote, so crowd appeal will be important. The event will take place at The Turkey Creek Division June meeting, so you have more than four months to prepare your entry. As in the past, there will be three places plus honorable mentions awarded for this challenge, plus awards for the "Most Creative," the "Most Whimsical," and as noted above the Best Animation entries. But, again, I want to emphasize that the participation is the important aspect of this program. So, if you're interested in being involved, start thinking about your model entry now. There is plenty of time, but don't put it off. This will be another fun event!






