

Bob McBean received 3 merit awards for structures.




Don Bronec received 2 merit awards for structures.



Greetings Modelers!

This is a reminder that we are planning for our first AP session for the Civil and Electrical certificates. I am combining these two as they tend to compliment each other and cover some of the same areas. The Civil Engineering certificate requires a certain amount of hand-laying track while the Electrical Engineering certificate asks you to demonstrate simple wiring of the track.

I am tentatively planning our first session at my home on Saturday, October 15th. If too few can make it on the 15th, I also have the 8th and 29th available.

So, we're going to work first with hand-laying track, including turn-outs and then later progress to wiring that same track-work. You will have a number of different types of track-work to choose from. For our first session, we will go over the actual certificate requirements and try to dispel any misconceptions about what is required. If we have time we'll begin discussing some of the basics in hand-laying track. It's not as hard as you might think.

I am providing a materials list, please review it and try to order the items you'll need early enough as sometimes it takes a while. Also, I am providing a link to my favorite website for hand-laid track, Fast-Tracks: http://www.handlaidtrack.com/ You can also get supplies at Walthers: http://www.walthers.com/

At this time, it appears that turnout length ties are available, but regular HO ones are all back-ordered. You can search online for them or if you like. You can also use 3/32 x 3/32 bass sticks which are pretty close for HO. You'll need to cut them to length. If you're working in a different scale, try the websites and then if necessary scale the bass sticks up or down as needed. You will also need some sort of roadbed to build your track-work on. I use Homasote which I got a number of years ago at Schutte Lumber. You can get "HomaBed" which is readymade Homasote cut for roadbed at: http://www.homabed.com/ or http://www.calroadbed.com/

Achievement Program Work Sessions


Starting in mid-September, I plan to start up the AP build sessions again. In the past we've built cars for the Master Builder Cars AP certificate. We all learned a lot and several very good cars came out of the build process.

We typically meet at my house once a month on Saturday at 1pm and work for about two hours. These sessions are usually relaxed and instructive.

This time we're going to work on the Civil and Electrical Engineering certificates. These two certificates compliment each other in their various tasks. We'll start the sessions with an overview of the AP requirements and try to take the mystery out of them. We'll follow up with additional sessions where we'll build track sections (switches, tangent track, crossovers etc.) depending on what you choose to build to fulfill the requirements for the certificate. We'll then follow all of that with wiring, including DCC friendly switches and the required wiring for the other track types. I will also use my own model railroad as an example of how these work.

From Harrogate to York by Train By Louis Seibel

During our trip to England in July, 2011, our daughter and son-in-law and two granddaughters and Marie and I took the train from Harrogate, located in North Yorkshire, in Great Brit-













ain to York on a Saturday morning. There were people from all walks of life – from businessmen to teenagers with purple and green hair to women going on "Hen Parties" (known in the US as bachelorette parties).

The train made four stops in the 60 miles between Harrogate and York. Not very many people got off, but more got on. By the time we reached York, the train was completely packed with passengers, with people standing toe to toe in the aisles.









When we exited the train in York, we stopped at a pasty shop for lunch. Pasties (pronounced pass-t) are turnovers filled with meat and potatoes. They were very good. From the station we walked about a half-mile to the National Railway Museum.

Admission to the museum is free. The museum is the largest of its kind in the world. The collections in the museum are



amazing and range from royal carriages to giant steam engines such as Mallards. There is also a huge warehouse that is filled with historical and railway related objects.

During my visit, I saw engines with creative names as The Rocket, The Evening Star Steam Engine, The Mallard, The Deltic and the Bullet Train. In the center of the museum there













is a full size turntable with the Mallard locomotive on it. They also have a library with types of historical pictures and books on railroading in Great Britain.

One interesting exhibit is a cutaway of a steam, The Atlantic Coastal Express, with descriptions of all the inner workings of a steam engine. There were also locomotives from as far away as China. They also have a full size workshop where the engines and carriages can be serviced and restored.

I spent two hours looking around and probably saw less than half of it. I could have stayed all day, but Marie and the








kids were ready to go.

We spent the rest of the day browsing through York which is filled with many shops. The train ride back to Harrogate was much less crowded.
