Jack Ferris and Don Ball got recognition for Merit Awards and AP Certificates ... lots of plaques and hardware! Jack Ferris received 3 Merit Awards for Civil Engineer projects which is great! Then along comes Don Ball ...

Mr. Celebrity! One Golden Spike Certificate ... (I lost count) ... One Scenery Merit Award ... 3 Civil Engineer Merit Awards ... ± 12 Structures Merit Awards ... 17 total awards ... AP Certificates for Scenery, Electrical Engineer, Structures ... !!! Don, as I am told, has built a very nice layout in his Blue Springs home, modeling the late 1800's era. I understand his layout is about half completed scenery of very high quality with many award winning structures. Hopefully Don will allow his layout to be on tour in July. **Congratulations!**







Our meeting was a great presentation by Ken Jenkins. Ken knows more about grain elevators and feed mills than you can imagine. Ken has built about \pm 25 scratchbuilt structures on his Rock Island RR, all of which follow their prototype very closely. Not all prototype structures are still standing, causing Ken to research through old photos, interviews with townspeople, and old RR material to closely reconstruct those structures. Ken's attention to detail on exactly how distribution piping, grain dryers and horizontal screw conveyors were all arranged is amazing. Ken explained the obvious framing characteristics between building manufacturers like Chief and Butler plus, the specific dryer models that went with each. He even discussed the way box cars were prepped to haul grain examples of special doors, etc.



All in all, very interesting! Ken's February presentation was about smaller "wood" and "metal building" elevators and feed mills. Ken has agreed to continue with a "Part II" presentation in May which will discuss the larger concrete constructed elevators and mills as they existed along the Rock Island RR in Kansas. It should be very interesting.

Spring is just around the corner and planning efforts are in full swing for our annual meeting July 14th. We will still need some help. We have been able to get our show advertised in MR & RMC this year, plus some other publications. We are pursuing video

clips of his year's show and events that we will use in future years. Properly edited, such video might get attention of the local TV channels to get us a few seconds of "mention" on newscasts. We could also use it on a website promotional video.

Jim Ballinger will present a clinic on mounting and wiring tortoise smooth machines to match the process easier and more forgiving as to allowing less accuracy in drilling holes under the layout in dark places. ... the Red Bull's Hot Breath is being felt on the South Side of Black Rock again ... Patrons and Modelers are concerned!!!



2012 Turkey Creek Division Modeling Challenge

Here we go again! For the 9th Annual TCD Modeling Challenge, the theme returns to the very first year of the Challenge...the Square Footer is back! So, this year, you may build and enter anything, yes....that's anything...as long as it fits on a 12" x 12" (or less) base. This is the theme voted on by the members attending the modeling challenge meeting last

So, what exactly does this mean for each of you? What it means is that you will not have any excuse whatsoever for not participating in the event. The playing field has been leveled, so to speak...we won't have any layout-sized dioramas (laugh). Let me emphasize here that the Modeling Challenge program was conceived to encourage everyone to participate in the enjoyment of building and displaying railroad models!! Please don't feel overwhelmed, intimidated, or that you don't have time to join in. It is hoped that by participating you will feel a sense of "inclusion", that of being "one of the group."

You may ask yourself, what sort of model could I enter? First, let me make this clarification....entries need not be constructed especially for this event. If you have something that you built in the past, please consider entering it, as long as it satisfies the size limit. Or, if there is a new project that you have been thinking about starting, now is a good time. You could limit your entry to a single car or locomotive..... remember any scale or gauge is acceptable, from Z to whatever will fit. Alternatively, you could focus on structures and enter a single structure or a scene with several smaller buildings, perhaps with basic details or highly detailed. Whichever, this could be an opportunity to build a component of your home layout....to be incorporated into the layout at a later date. Several of the past entries have been used in this way, to a great benefit of the modeler. This is intended to be a fun filled event, with the entry possibilities only limited by your imagination, creativity, and enthusiasm to participate (and size).

The judging will be by popular vote, so crowd appeal will be important. The event will take place at our June 26th meeting, so you have more than seven months to prepare your entry. As in the past, there will be three places plus honorable mentions awarded for this challenge, plus awards for the "Most Creative" and the "Most Whimsical" entries. In addition, we will continue with an award for the "Best Animation/Sound" for those that want to make things move or make noise. But, again, I want to emphasize that the participation is the important aspect of this program. So, if you're interested in being involved, start thinking about your model entry now. There is plenty of time, but don't put it off. This will be another fun event!

For fun, I have included below portions of the original notice of the 1st TC Modeling Challenge...also a Square Footer Challenge. Note to Superintendent Diehl - you can see that even I initially referred to this even as a "contest." However, I believe that the term "challenge" is more in keeping with the intent of encouraging participation by all members.




