

In this Power Point presentation I share my adventures in creating snow scenes and the materials I used.



In the second part of the presentation Ron takes the same diorama he used for the snow scenes...modifies it by bashing it with a claw hammer and then creates the "Little Ella Gold Mine" diorama that was published in the Narrow Gauge and Short Line Gazette in the Nov/Dec 2007 issue.



The March 16, 2013 Model Railroad Show and Swap Meet at Remington's in Springfield, MO is where you should be if you are interested in trains or are interested in getting the name of your company in front of an estimated 2,000 people or you are planning to sell your equipment of all scales and other collectibles.

Our Fall Show drew 494 people. There were 115 swap tables including displays by a magazine and a model train repair technician. Publicity for this event consisted of a listing on 78 area newspapers, radio and television calendars, a direct mail piece sent to people who have attended our shows in the past five years and a news release to the Springfield media.

This will be our 35th annual Spring Show and we are going all out to make it the best ever.

The theme in March is "Relive the Memories". We want parents and grandparents to bring their children to the show to experience the railroading. Scheduled activities include the opportunity to buy chances to win a \$350 framed, signed and numbered print by nationally known watercolor artist John Fulton.

A portion of the proceeds from ticket sales as well as chances to win the Fulton print will go to Crosslines food pantry which serves families in crisis in Greene County. Since 1969, Crosslines has provided emergency food, job services, rental/mortgage assistance and special holiday programs. The Lionel Collector's Club of America has agreed to sanction our show. That organization will be conducting a Lionel Track Laying Contest for three age groups in which the individual winners will receive a nice prize. They will also be offering door prizes to their members.

Kids will have the opportunity to take controls of a virtual locomotive and then receive a "Certified Locomotive Engineer" certificate.

Kids will also have the opportunity to run a Lionel Train around the track while blowing the whistle and ringing the bell. These participants will receive another certificate naming them as an "Official Whistle Blower".

Older "kids" including adults will be given the opportunity to participate in a switching challenge and recognized for completing the challenge.

The Kiddie Train will be on hand for a few hours during the show to provide rides around the parking lot for adults as well as children.

Brad Slone is scheduled to bring his presentation on the Frisco Railroad's Fort Leonard Wood Branch. Other clinicians are being sought. Other possibilities include Louis Griesemer describing how he models with a 3-D computer.

Ron Williams MMR will present a clinic from Model Railroader magazine called Model Railroading 101 which will help people who are new to or are interested in knowing more about the hobby.

And attendees will have the opportunity to meet and visit with manufacturers of model railroad products. They can learn what is new and how each company goes about creating and developing its products.

Owners of pre-1970 locomotives can bring their items to the show and find out if they have any worth. If they are not running a technician will be on hand to diagnose the problem and provide an estimate to get it back in running shape.

We anticipate filling the space with swap tables and operating model railroads from Bentonville, Arkansas, Wichita, Kansas, Kansas City, MO, Omaha, NE, St. Louis, MO as well as Branson and Springfield. Some of the displays have never been seen at our shows.

There will be many door prizes with at least five train sets to be given away and some lucky couple will win tickets to ride the Arkansas & Missouri Railroad.

Lunch consisting of the attendee's choice of a hamburger or hotdog with chips and beverage for \$2.50 will be available. And a bottomless cup of coffee will be available all day for \$1.00.
