

Clinic - August 2013

THREE IN ONE CLINIC BY RON MORSE, MMR - Not many people take the plunge and model snow on their layout and that includes me. However, I have had a lot of fun playing in the snow on small dioramas. In this Power Point presentation I share my adventures in creating snow scenes and the materials I used.







Visiting the Turkey Creek Division and other Model Railroads in the US by Kelly Loyd MMR Australasian Region Secretary

My fascination for trains began at an early age when our family lived 2 blocks from the St. Louis – San Francisco RR main line in the small town of St. James. My brother and I would race to the trackside when we heard a 'Frisco freight blow for the crossing at the East end of town and watch as the Mandarin and White units thundered past the feed store with a freight in tow, a sight both exciting



and terrifying for small boys. The love of trains grew out of these early boyhood experiences and also from being lucky enough to have a Grandfather who was a railroader. He would take me to work with him at the interlocking tower where he was the 2nd trick operator and I learned how to hang orders, use the radio and operate the interlocking. I was fully capable of operating the interlocking unsupervised at the tender age of 10,



which surprised the Trainmaster one evening when he visited the tower and Grandpa said, "Kelly, line that KCS



out of town." Such things remain etched upon the memory... 35 Normal, 37 Normal, 36 Right, 23 Normal, 21 Reverse and 24 Left.

A fellow Australian modeler noted at one time that there were three types of Model Railroaders in operations: - The Railfan, The Yardmaster and The Dispatcher. Railfans love to watch trains run, no switching. Yardmasters enjoy running a train, but they enjoy lots of switching, both in the yard and with a Peddler Freight. Dispatchers really enjoy overseeing the operation and "running" the entire railroad. He went on to say that The Dispatcher is a rare type and he was surprised to meet one. I think it was that exposure to interlocking and also CTC at other locations that sparked my interest in Dispatching, something



that has lasted all my life.

Like so many others, I asked my parents for a train set for Christmas in 1968. I recall seeing it in the five and dime store for the princely sum of \$13. I set up that oval of track in my room and soon grew tired of running round and round so the next summer, I got a job delivering newspapers and saved up enough for a turnout and some



track. Looking back now, I realize that was the true beginning of my desire to operate a model railroad and not just run trains around without purpose. Of course, I didn't deliver products, but I did load up a gondola with chocolates and "delivered" those.

I got a permanent layout as a teenager, a 4x8 with an oval, industry spur and a small yard. This was a lot of fun and I wired it with blocks to have a mainline train and a



yard switcher. There were no car cards but I still operated by having the switcher make up a "delivery" to the spur track, push the train out onto the main, then park the yard switcher and have the main line locomotive come and hook on, then a couple of circuits of the oval followed by exchanging the cars. There weren't even any buildings on the layout, all done by imagination. After High School, I spent 2 years working for The Milwaukee Road in 1980, in the very same job that my Grandfather taught me. The love of railroading and model trains stayed with me through life and finally I was able to build another layout some 21 years later.

My friend Gerry Hopkins likes to say, "Kelly was not going to have scenery, or operate or have signals. He was just having a plain plywood layout. He has failed to achieve those things." I started building my current layout in 2003 which began as an Atlas Track plan, but was expanded out via two "wings" into a nicely operating model railroad. In December 2003, I joined the NMRA in the Australasian Region and made a lot of new friends who shared my enthusiasm for model railroads. I decided to tackle the Achievement Program and started out with Model Railroad Engineer – Electrical. Well, you have to wire your layout, so why not get credit for doing it? My background includes a lot of Electronics experience. Even so, I learned a few things from doing that certificate. Other AP certificates were to follow in time, then a lull in the weather until I completed the Motive Power in 2012 to complete the seven required for Master Model



Railroader. Getting a certificate was great, but even greater was the friendships forged and lessons learned all along the way.

I'd have to say that the greatest asset and benefit in the NMRA is the members. Without exception, every place I have visited with NMRA members I have been made to feel very welcome and shared many good times, learning, chatting and operating. I've been fortunate to see and operate on some of the most amazing model railroads in the world, places like the North American Prototype Model-





ers in Milwaukee, Mike Richtsdorf's Norfolk and Western in Chicago, Gary Hankin's Santa Fe, Chuck Hitchcock's Argentine District and Bruce Chubb's Sunset Valley Oregon System. Then of course there is our own grass



roots group, local modelers who share fun, operations, learning and general camaraderie. This social aspect is one of the best things about our organization to me and something I would like to see continue for years to come.






Kelly is employed as a Senior Software Engineer at Civica Pty Limited, a Software Vendor providing an Enter-

Here are some highlights of what happened at the Board of Directors Meeting over the weekend:

- New Director Kathy Millatt, from the British Region, joined the Board as the new Atlantic Director. Former President Mike Brestel joined the Board as the new At-Large World-Wide Director. And Western Director Jack Hamilton was returned for another term.
