Kevin Lee Keeler



Would you like to learn more about digital photography? Join Crossroads' Digital Photography class and meet others with the same interest. Ron Morse, a



Turkey Creek Members...

Subject: Directors Report January 2014

The MCoR Directors held their annual meeting in Kansas City/Antioch Public Library on Saturday, January 4, 2014, chaired by Whit Johnson, President.

New Officers elected in Spring 2013 are:

President, Whit Johnson from Newton, Iowa Vice President, Phil Bonzon, MMR from University City, Missouri (St. Louis) Treasurer, Robert Folkman from Ames, Iowa Secretary, Barbara Lundquist from Papillion, Nebraska (Omaha)

Actions:

- The Board approved Omaha's bid to hold the Regional Convention in 2016.
- The Board <u>rejected</u> the motion to establish an Administrative Assistant to the President.

Discussions:

There was a significant discussion regarding the fact that October 2013, MCoR lost its 501(c)(3) tax exempt status. MCoR now has to go back to 2013 and pay taxes on its income henceforth.

MCoR lost its 501(c)(3) because the annual 990-N form was not filed for 3 years! ... and notices from the IRS were ignored.

The result is NMRA is now pursuing a change in its "home base" to Missouri which has more relaxed detail requirements for meetings, etc. Once changed, MCoR will seek subordinate status under national umbrella which means MCoR will cease to be independent and national will file proper annual forms, etc. This may take 2 to 4 or more years.

This has no impact on Turkey Creek Division as we have maintained our 501(c)(3) status properly. What this national push to "umbrella" all regions and divisions under their legal umbrella means to Turkey Creek Division is not completely clear. I'm sure that national cannot just "take us over" without a vote of our members. This issue will continue to develop in the future and will require some kind of action by the members in the future.

Our 501(c)(3) status is important to our group and in my opinion, we should be careful not to jeopardize our not-for-profit tax exempt status. As an example, we currently rent Shawnee Mission school facilities for our monthly meetings and our rate is less than one-half that of the general public rates. We also pay no income tax on our interest earnings or earnings from our annual show.

We need NMRA national, but should we abandon our independent 501(c)(3) status, is very questionable in my opinion.

Membership continues to be everyone's concern. As everyone realizes, our membership continues to age and it is harder and harder to maintain our total membership. It behooves us all to encourage young person's interest in the hobby. We all need to be open to ideas which would encourage young people to become involved. Model Railroading is not a toy, but it probably started in us all as a toy.

2012 MCoR membership started at 936, gained 12 to end at 948. 2013 MCoR membership lost 62, to end at 892. (I don't understand the math either.)
