

Jeff has won over 50 awards at National Narrow Gauge and National Model Railroad Association Conventions. He has been published in the Narrow Gauge and Short Line Gazette, Sn3 Modeler, Finescale Railroader, and Railroad Model Craftsman magazines. Jeff is currently working on a large dual gauge S scale layout depicting the Denver and Rio Grande from Chama to Santa Fe, New Mexico as well as the trackage shared with the Santa Fe Railroad. He is hand laying his track and used redwood spline roadbed.

He also co-owned Tomalco, a manufacturer of flex-track, turnouts and brass investment castings. A life member of the NMRA and a member of the NMRA 400 Club, he is also active in the Friday Night Boomers, a St. Louis narrow gauge group. His work has been featured in the Sn3 Modeler, the Model Railroad Craftsman and the Narrow Gauge Down Under.

Clear Creek & Quicksilver Railroad

Allen's layout is a 1:20.3 railroad with outside landscaping depicting the site for the Georgetown Loop (trackage still under construction) and inside logging theme with benchwork and roadbed in progress (approximately 250 feet currently installed) and growing. This is also the home of Fun & Games (figures of all scales), Missouri Locomotive Company (large scale brass logging locomotives) and Sparkling Star Models (circus theme cars and wagons). Boonslick Model Railroad Club

Boonslick Model Railroad Club was started about 4 years ago with having a location and a small layout to begin with. We meet for about two years before that just having meetings at my hobby shop. We have 19 members at present. We are now located at 525 Spring St, Boonville Mo in old city hall. Our entrance is on the north (back side) of building. The city of Boonville has been providing our locations free of any charges. They are with out the best city government to work with. We have been at the present location for two (2) years. Our HO layout is 22' square. Members can lease modules and do what ever they like to their modules.

At present we are expanding it into and through four other rooms going through walls into each room. One wall being three layers thick brick, surprise. The rooms name are, MoPac, D&RG, Frisco and MKT. Will be some 50 + feet long though the four rooms and back. Will be a long dog bone one main line with modules coming off main for industries and etc. Each room will have flowing scenery, but each room will depict different seasons and or regions. The clublayout will be open from 1-5 Sunday for folks heading home to view.

Carl Haake

Carl's layout is a freelance design covering roughly 15' by 20'. It is not modeled after any specific railroad. It has a dual mainline with two passing sidings one short and one long and is nearly complete. The layout is DC controlled with a master switch board to control power to different tracks. Construction on the table started in August of 2007. Carl started laying track that Labor day weekend. The mainline track is code 100 and the expansion yard is code 83. Carl and his three sons have a good time running trains together. Five rolling cabinets loaded with other cars and locomotives provides for a variety of operation. Carl and the boys mainly run U.P. BNSF and Amtrak.

Central Missouri Railroad Association The CMRRA is located in the Warrenton outlet mall and encompasses three different layouts covering



three gauges. The club has done a great job creating these layouts and will be open Thursday afternoon prior to the beginning of the convention and Sunday following the convention. Arthur and Kathy Kristofik

Arthur and Kathyown America's Best Value Inn in Holts Summit, Missouri. For many years Arthur has given over a large meeting room to his model train collection. During the holiday season, the layout is open to the public and a separate Christmas Village is added to the display. Arthur spends virtually the entire year preparing for the next holiday season. Currently the display has three levels and up to eight trains can be running at the same time. Many different scenes are included and most are animated. An amusement park, maintenance shops, hot air balloons and even the Grand Canvon are modeled. Many of the figures are hand-painted by Kathy. Arthur belongs to the Lionel Collectors Club of America and has been in the hobby since 1962. Kenneth & Randy Hackman:

Freelance HO and HOn3 Railroad

This HO and HOn3 model train layout, was started, licensed and copyrighted in April 1972. Kenneth R. Hackman and wife Belva Lee Hackman started designing this large display (over 2,000 sq. feet) in the year of 1988. The layout construction started in their custom designed and built log estate located in Jefferson City Missouri, on the Union Pacific R.R. westbound main line in the year of 1991. Kenneth planned this layout for DC but is currently switching over to DCC. The layout is a freelanced current design planned to duplicate the Colorado landscape. The building and planning was with Kenneth's friend John Allen, Bud McClurry, and Roy Turner. They all became friends after meeting at a train show in California. The layout has 11 different levels with 7 helix's. The layout goes 3 feet below the foundation of the home. It is a point to point operation with an alternative route that is a loop on the top level. There is also a harbor that trains can only get to by useing a remote control barge that sits on a custom built and designed cart just so only the barge shows. Kenneth is a master model railroader. This layout features scratch built and kitbashed buildings with plaster mountains extending the entire layout from floor to ceiling.

O.c. Railroad: G (Fn3)

The O.c. Railroad is a club comprised of members who are engaged in the construction of a G (Fn3) scale layout based roughly on the narrow gauge lines of Colorado. When completed it will be comprised of 1000's of feet of track and will include multiple towns, and industries and will have 4 tunnels, mountains and at least two water features. The layout also has been designed with sidewalks and benches to facilitate its use and observation by the public. It is the intent of the members that the layout will always be available for people to run trains or view train operations with no admission charge. The layout is located on the property of Kenneth Hackman northwest of Jefferson City, Missouri. About 1/3 of what has been planned has been constructed to date with the railroad being the recipient of gifts of construction materials from Lowes, Quaker Windows, Rusk Home Improvement, etc. and a lot of volunteer labor. The layout is designed for the running of locomotives that are battery powered or live steam.

It is the intent of the O.c. Railroad for the layout to provide a means of diverting the attention of young people from gang activity, drugs, and alcohol through the enjoyment of model railroading. We offer opportunities for youth to be involved in the construction of the layout, buildings, etc. When operational, the layout will provide the opportunity for youth to run trains and, due to the sophisticated design of the layout, will also be instructive in the details of actual railroad operations. To encourage vouth participation, contacts have been made to bring school groups out to see the O.c. Railroad even as it is being constructed. We also hope to involve the local Boys and Girls Clubs and the Big Brother, Big Sister programs. The O.c. railroad will also make itself available to be reserved for group events in addition to being available for general public use.

Winnebago Northern.

Scale: O (2-rail). Layout size: 45' x 25'. Mainline length: 150'. Minimum radius: 57". Orientation: 1950's-1960's, interurban, full-length passenger, big engine freight Preferred prototypes: North Shore Line, Chicago & North Western, Milwaukee Road, Soo Line, Pennsylvania.

Peter's layout is located in Columbia and will be available for viewing 1-5 Sunday for folks heading home from the convention.

Possum Run Railroad

The Possum Run Railroad is a 22' X 20' HO scale layout. The track plan is basically an up and over loop design inspired by the Rock Island Railroad that parallels Highway 50 between Rosebud and St. Louis Missouri. Some of the little towns the railroad passed through along the way are included. These towns provide plenty of opportunity for building both non-revenue models and models representing the industries served by the railroad. The railroad is well underway with almost all track work complete. Several towns are also complete or nearly complete. Scenery is roughed in with some details. Operation is controlled by DC.

Missouri Texas & Western Railroad.

Louis Eggerding

Gulf. Missouri and Ohio

Scale: O (3-rail). Layout size: 33' x 18'. Mainline length: 110'. Three dogbone loops Minimum radius: 0-54. Orientation: 1950's steam, trolley, and diesel, freight and passenger Preferred prototypes: GM&O, Wabash, MKT, Pennsy, NYC, Lionel Lines Lou's layout is located in Columbia and will be open for viewing 1-5 on Sunday for folks heading home from the convention.

John Scherr's

HOn3 Rio Grande Southern

John's two level layout features much of the northern district of the Rio Grande Southern and Rico - the lines only division point. Most of the railroad is in a 16x22 room. A fiddle yard and helix are in the adjacent shop area. Train control is DCC by Lenz. A small staging area (Ridgway or Durango) is hidden below Rico. Several scenes are nearly complete wwith many of the remaining scenes roughed in. A continuous run is possible and include about 150' of main line. The branch to Pandora adds another 20 feet or so. Engines can be turned as Rico, Illium, Pandora and Staging.

The layout is greatly enhanced by the beautiful backdrops painted by St Louis artist Greg Gray. Some liberties have been taken to allow inclusions of favorite scenes. The time is set post RGS operation to justify some of the details. John likes to think that the RGS restoration depicted here was inspired by the Durango Silverton and the Cumbres & Toltec

railroads. In addition, some old time details have been included as you might find restored ghost towns or theme parks. In the future, some non prototypical locomotives and equipment may be seen operating as well.
