



## Twin Cities and Western theme brings variety, significant improvements to switching layout

Just a couple months into 2017, the three person crews have experienced changes, challenges, and new features during early shakedown sessions.

Excellent code 83 track laying, wiring, better design, individual jobs (with more elbow room), and down stairs toilet privileges for the whole crew highlight differences compared to the PGR. See related article, page four.

Special handling became the watchword during the third trick as the West End Turn brought the first of many-more-to-come mammoth cotton picking machines via flatcar for shipment east through Hopkins last month. The wide load machinery required extra moves at the grain co-op to clear the main. More are expected throughout the year though volume is uncertain at this date.

## New crews gain experience, offer suggestions to improve operations

Chark, Doug, and Keith appear busy during a TCWR shakedown session held in February. The railroad seems to be smoothing out, as promptly implemented suggestions help crews function more efficiently and (supposedly) have more fun.

The first months of 2017 brought the TCWR to life, though not with much scenery. The emphasis at this point is reliability of track, clear instructions, and enhancements that make the layout run smoother.

Among the "better than it used to be" ideas implemented are a couple from Russ Hayden. Operators bringing trains in or out of Twin Cities staging now can view all four tracks and the detection equipment by looking at the same mirror-mounted now vertically along the angled backdrop in staging. Russ also donated another couple dozen trees to help separate the town of Buffalo Lake from the not-so-near-byin-real life Hector and Hopkins.

He proved to be the ace spell-checker, noting a missing "h" from Soutern (sic) Minnestoa Beet Sugar Coop. Three previous crews failed to note the error.

Post-mortem of 2015-16 short line railroad recalls shortcomings

With memories of Progressive Rail quickly fading into history after its two year reincarnation in Shawnee, Kansas, regular operators on the Minnesota short line recently aired their observations. Among those shared with the superintendent were the following:

- Dissatisfaction with the mostly single car spots at Airlake Industrial Park, a feature predominantly due to overall space limitations in Lakeville
- "Unfair" work distribution created with the two person Lakeville crews, who sometimes differed on the respective roles of conductor vs. engineer during the operating sessions
- Less than optimal (read marginal) track work that appeared unsightly but sometimes caused derailments
- · Reverse seniority rules that allowed those traveling from the greatest distance priority for jobs
- Pent-up (literally) crew dissatisfaction over privileges to downstairs toilet facilities, limiting usage to the Northfield yardmaster and requiring others to "go" upstairs
- · Lack of (during the first year) a passing track at Lakeville, thereby requiring crews to think and plan ahead more than they would otherwise

Yes, there was at times fingerpointing among the crews at Lakeville. While the engineer instructions were clear, some crew members chose not to read or follow them, thereby creating additional work, inefficiency, waste of fuel, and controversies. Sometimes those carried over to discussions during weekly meal gatherings.






