# Hello to all Turkey Creek Division members.

Fellow Model Railroaders. The weather has turned Spring-like, and I've decided to sit outdoors and write the Superintendent's Column. Yard work has begun. Even still, I have model projects in progress. Right now, I'm Scratch building a house. I have no place for it on my existing model railroad; however, I have plans to expand my model railroad in the future. I'm also hoping to use it for the Structures Achievement Certificate. The plan is based on a laser-cut kit. I modified some items, thus it's not identical to the kit.

This brings up the topic of tools. I'm an x-acto knife kind of modeler. My tool set is minimal, and I make do. That doesn't mean that I'm not interested in gadgets and widgets that make construction easier. It's more that I'm cheap and don't have space to store things. I admire modelers that have neat shops with everything in its place and the projects are well organized. I do clean up my shop prior to every project, but within a few hours, my work space is a mess. To add new tools would only increase the mess. A laser cutter would make the current project easier and more accurate, but it wouldn't be used enough to justify the cost. 3-D printing does offer the option of doing a design and sending it to a company to print. Thus, I may try my hand at 3-D printing someday. Now, someone is going to tell me that I can use the same approach (have a company produce my design) with laser cutting. I haven't researched the possibilities, yet. This month's clinic is on 3-D printing. Come and see what's involved from experts within our organization.

Related to the upcoming Turkey Creek Train Show. We need clinics. I'm not certain how many clinics we need, nor do I know the length of the clinics. I don't care if you've presented it recently. Hopefully, some of the attendees of the convention will not be regular Turkey Creek members and will not have attended the NMRA national convention last year. Thus, a reprised clinic is acceptable. Please let me know, if you have a new or reprised clinic to present at the Train Show. As always, we are looking for volunteers. Please consider lending your aid.






