Scratchbuilding a HO-Scale Billboard

I had the need to create a billboard to advertise a restaurant in the small town on my HO model railroad. Now, I could have pulled out the Walthers Catalog and ordered a kit and adjusted the artwork to suite my needs. What fun is that? Instead I searched my limited supply of *Model Railroader* back issues for some inspiration. In the April 1999 issue (p. 111) I found an article by Lionel Strang with pictures of an N-scale billboard that he assembled from a Blair Line's kit. The pictures gave me the rough proportions and the general design of the structure.

I used a computer-drawing program to create a series of templates for assembling the billboard. The billboard design features three round posts cut from a 1/8" dowel. All the remaining members and supports are made from 1/16" x 3/32" basswood strips. With careful cutting, you will need one 36" dowel and two 36" basswood strips. The artwork for the sign was done with the same software and printed using an inkjet printer on a Matte finish paper for printing photographs. This paper is thicker than standard paper. This approach allows for the attachment of the sign directly to the cross members and frame rather than first attaching the sign to a piece of wood or styrene.

Assembly:

First, I cut out all the wood parts. The wood parts include: three round posts, five cross members that go between the sign and the posts, the frame around the front of the sign, and the four angled rear braces. Next, I cut out the templates and mounted them on a piece of scrap 1" x 4" placing a piece of wax paper over each template. The individual pieces can either be taped or pinned into position. I assembled the cross members and posts for the back, followed by the frame for the front and the four angle braces. I attached these parts using medium viscosity cyanoacrylate glue.

At this point I painted all the wood parts and the back of the sign. I chose a dark brown color, but a light gray might give you a weathered look. After the paint dried, I attached the front frame to the sign on the artwork side and then the sign to the cross members. I used contact cement designed to work on paper and wood. I allowed this to set overnight before the final assembly and touch up painting. I have a jig for holding the angled braces to the posts. Two angle braces attach to the center post and one to each of the outside posts. I attached the angled brackets with the vertical supports on the opposite side from the posts. After touching up the paint, the project was ready to place on the railroad.




The project took me about 3 evenings. The first evening was spent cutting the wood parts, initial assembling, and painting. The second evening was attaching the frames to

the sign and the sign to the cross members, and the last evening was the final assembly. It's a relatively simple project that yields great results.
