Superintendent Report:

Fellow Model Railroaders. I am recovering from the illness that kept me from attending the August Turkey Creek Division meeting. I had just returned from a trip to Maryland and West Virginia. Somewhere near the end of this trip, I ate something that didn't agree with me.

Model Railroad Research: Background research is an important part of designing a realistic model railroad. Now, I'm not trying to create an exact replica, but I do want the viewer to have the correct impression for the setting of the railroad. The purpose of the above-mentioned trip was to scout out scenery ideas for my new layout. The design of my railroad is in a state of flux. Originally, the model railroad was to be a section of the Baltimore and Ohio mainline in the eastern panhandle of West Virginia. However, I just finished reading *Tall Pines and Winding Rivers* by Benjamin Kline, Jr. on the logging railroads of western Maryland. This has piqued my interest in possibility of combining a section of B&O mainline with a small logging railroad west of Cumberland, MD. So, off to Maryland I went with a brand new digital SLR camera. I took pictures of the mountain scenery, structures in small towns, the site of a former lumber mill, and some current CSX (nee B&O) trackage. I got plenty of ideas. The next stage will be to sketch some plans that fit the limited footprint that is dedicated to the new model railroad.

That was the first half of the trip. The other reason for the trip was to pick up my daughter, who spent the summer as an intern in Washington, DC. The return trip was not devoid of railfanning. I got some pictures of Washington Union Station. We stopped in Harper's Ferry, WV; however, inclement weather kept me from getting pictures. Harper's Ferry is part of my original model railroad plan. The best backdrop scenery shots were at Kentuck Knob, a Frank Lloyd Wright designed house in southwestern Pennsylvania. All in all, it was a great model railroad planning trip. I'm looking for any suggestions or input you may wish to offer.

The September meeting will be a demonstration clinic on 3-D printing. Clinics: At the time I'm writing this, I still need a clinic for October. Also, it's not too early to start planning next year's meeting clinics. It would be helpful, if someone volunteers to assist me and future superintendents in locating clinicians. Let me know, if you want to present a clinic or volunteer to

Report of the 2019 National Association of S Gaugers National Convention

too many S gauge modelers in the Turkey Creek Division, I thought that others in the division might be interested in what the national convention for another model railroad organization is like. The NASG is the umbrella organization for all 1/64 scale model railroaders whether they are scale, high rail, American Flyer, or narrow gauge modelers or collectors. It was established in 1975 out of an organization known as the Northeastern S Gaugers Association and currently has about 1,600 members. It publishes a magazine six times a year and holds an annual convention organized by a local S scale club. Sometimes these conventions are held jointly with the NMRA national convention, most recently in 2011 in Sacramento. Kansas City has hosted the convention three times – 1972, 1989, and 2015.

The 2019 convention was held in Cincinnati, Ohio and was sponsored by the Central Ohio S Gaugers based in Columbus, Ohio. The primary attendance was about 260, including one day registrants but excluding spouses. The convention began on Tuesday, July 30 with a tour of EnterTRAINment Junction, billed as the home of the world's largest model train display. The Wednesday tour was a ride on the Turtle Creek Valley Flyer train with lunch at the Golden Lamb restaurant followed by a separate tour of the American Sign Museum. The Thursday tour was a behind the scenes tour of the recently restored 1934 Art Deco Cincinnati Union Terminal followed by a luncheon cruise on the Ohio River aboard the chartered River Queen riverboat. We participated in that tour which had 140 in attendance. For the Cincinnati Union Terminal we were broken into groups of about 20 with our own tour guide spending time in each area of the terminal including the Amtrak station, the former tower which retained its track diagram, the executive offices, an up close description of the murals and artwork, and the S scale depiction of downtown Cincinnati with operating trains and trolleys but only partially reassembled following the renovation. Photos of the front and interior of the terminal are attached. The river cruise featured a very good buffet and narration about both sides of the river.

The convention itself featured a dealer hall (much of which was used American Flyer equipment) with no major manufacturers present, ten clinics (two of which were cancelled), and a comprehensive display from the A. C. Gilbert (manufacturer of American Flyer trains and Erector sets) Museum. Evening activities included a complementary Cincinnati Skyline Chili bar and the Saturday evening banquet, awards ceremony, and live auction. The Friday after-

noon business meeting was well attended due to a complementary Graeter's Ice Cream sundae bar that preceded the meeting. Key items at the business meeting were the conversion from a 501(c)(7) social organization to a 501(c)(3) charitable organization and having a presence at the summer and winter National Farm Toy Shows in Dyersville, Iowa. Many farm toys are 1/64 scale and the shows draw from 3,000 to 7,000 attendees with an average age about 20 years less than that of model railroaders. The NASG had a display at the summer show and there was significant interest from attendees wanting to learn more about mounting their models on appropriate flat cars for display or in their factory dioramas.

The NASG convention included a model contest with significantly different criteria than the NMRA has for their contests (although NMRA judging is sometimes offered as well.) The contest had a good number of entries with many being very nice models. Because many of the entries are high rail (oversize knuckle couplers and deep flange wheels) these features are not considered in NASG judging. My personal favorites were a WCF&N (Waterloo, Cedar Falls & Northern) interurban freight motor and a Canadian Pacific dome observation car (one of four built from 1902 through 1906.) Photos of these are attached.

There were 19 home layouts of all scales open on Sunday, August 4 after the convention ended. Unfortunately, it was only possible to visit a few of these. We visited the O scale Pennsylvania & Western high rail layout of Bob Bartizek in Lebanon, Ohio. This 1,100 square foot layout is fully sceniced with a 550 foot mainline running through the Pennsylvania mountains. Photos of his J-1 2-10-4 and Lima transfer switcher are attached. The second layout was Jim Rollwage's HO scale Denver Pacific in Wilmington, Ohio. It covers 900 square feet and models the Union Pacific main and secondary lines from Denver north to Cheyenne and Julesburg. Photos of both passenger and freight trains on his layout are attached.


The awards presented after the banquet included the Bernie Thomas Memorial Award for meritorious service to S scale or the NASG, the highest honor that can be bestowed by the NASG. This year's recipient was the late Paul Stevens of Kansas City. Paul was a well known American Flyer collector and dealer and served as NASG President from 1997 through 2001 and was the primary organizer of the 1989 Kansas City NASG convention. Paul was easily recognized by his 7' 1" height and died in September 2018. Despite being best known for his vast knowledge of American Flyer, he was also involved in scale S gauge modeling. I will be presenting the award to his son Mark in September since his widow, Dody died in February 2019.

The 2020 NASG convention will be held in Minneapolis, Minnesota from July 7 through 11 and will be sponsored by the Pines & Prairies S Scale Workshop.




