2021 Turkey Creek Division Modeling Challenge by Larry Alfred, MMR

Well, another month has gone by and we have seen several additional commitments to participate in the Challenge. Even with this, I will take this opportunity to push everyone to complete, work on, or begin a model entry for the 2021 Modeling Challenge. The Challenge is one of the highlights of the Turkey Creek Division's annual calendar. It provides an opportunity for all member to participate with others. As an additional incentive to bring an entry, we will have a drawing for two \$25 gift certificates. Everyone bringing an entry will be eligible for the drawing.

The Challenge will be held in essentially the same manner as in previous years. The most significant change from past years will be the limit of one-foot square for the entry base. Please don't let this be a disincentive to your decision to enter a model. It's fun! The Challenge is planned for our August 2021 meeting. This gives you plenty of time to prepare an entry, including the possibility of incorporating a make-and-take model with your entry. Just to clarify, entries will be limited to only one per person. There have been instances in the past where two entries were allowed. A limit to one entry is felt to be the fairest way to proceed.

I was asked to remind you all regarding the awards associated with the Modeling Challenge. Each year, there are six awards given as a result of the popular vote. They are:

First Place overall Second Place overall **Third Place overall** Most Whimsical (Red Bull Award) Best Special Effects (sound, lighting, animation) Best use of a Make-and-Take model

2021 Challenge (Repeat of the 2004 Rules)

So, what can you build on a one square foot base? That's your challenge for the first annual Turkey Creek Division Modeling Challenge! In G scale, you could fit a RGS 50,000 gallon water tank in one square foot and not much more. In Z scale, you could probably model the Kansas City West Bottoms. In HO, you'll be somewhere in between.

There is no restriction on how high your scene can go, so you could model a mountain or a twelve story building. If you're into Colorado mining, you could put an ore mill on a mountain side with tracks at the bottom for cars to pick up the refined ore. If coastal railroading is your bag, then a pier scene may be for you. Another thought might be a scene with an overpass with a train on the lower and upper levels.

If you're into city scenes, you could model the backside of some trackside tenements with Mrs. McGurty waving at the engineer while she's hanging out laundry. Another scene that would be interesting would be a station with passengers waiting for a train or perhaps boarding a passenger train.

There is no restriction on the diorama except that the base cannot exceed one square foot – that's 12" by 12" maximum size. Can it be smaller? Sure. If you already have a base you want to use and it's 12" X 12" or less in size, that's fine. If you have a base that's 16" X 8", that's NOT FINE. Do you have to have a train on the diorama? Nope. It's up to you what to include.

The judging will be by popular vote, so crowd appeal will be the rule. There will be three places awarded for this challenge. So, if you're entering a diorama, start thinking about your model now. There is plenty of time, but don't put it off. This will be a fun event!

Ok...final plea...please participate!! It is lots of fun!

The Bluebell Railway is one of the first preserved railway lines in England, all of their trains are pulled by steam engines and the railroad is a quick train ride from Central London. The weekend I was there was a special weekend where they ran extra trains of freight and passenger cars pulled by freight locomotives. The National Railway museum in York is one of the largest Railway museums in the world and very easy to get to from York Station.

York itself has a neat 8 track station on a curve, there is even a great pub on one of the platforms with outside seating making for a great train watching location. North Yorkshire Moors Railway is another historic line that runs from Pickering to Whitby through a national park. The Firth of Forth is the famous cantilevered railroad bridge built in the 1880's.

In Clay Center, Ken has installed crossing signals at street crossings, just like the signals existed in 1969. They operate with train detection, flash and act like the prototype. One set at 6th Street has crossing arms which operate.





In Belleville, Ken knew of a grain/fertilizer operation that he did not model. That business was not served by rail, although it was situated adjacent to trackage. Well, in "Ken Jenkins protocol", Ken recently decided to model the facility. He had very limited photos of the buildings, the site and its surroundings (he previously saw no need because it was not served by RR). These buildings are now gone.



Ken pieced together internet photos, made educated guesses on dimensions and exact layout, etc.

Scenery modifications, including a road bridge relocation, is progressing.

Wah-lah....a model is in progress!

To model the corrugated round tanks, Ken used Rix plastic tanks and cut the overall circumference down to make a smaller circle to match prototype. He is going to add a siding (maybe modeled "abandoned"). He will be building two separate "legs" for the grain/fertilizer distribution. In 1969, trucks like 2 ton box beds, delivered and picked up grain from the large building. The trucks drove inside.

Obviously, a fun project! Not complete yet, but when complete I will photo the final models. If you ever get a chance to see Ken's layout, <u>don't pass</u>. It's well worth the little extra drive to Basehor, Kansas. You'll see 19 completely different grain elevator businesses, construction of wood, concrete and wrinkled tin. Very much look like each of the prototypes.
