Mike Fyten's S Scale Kaw Valley RR

The layout is loosely based on a prototype railroad named the Kansas City, Kaw Valley, and Western Railroad. It was often referred to as the Kaw Lines or Kaw Valley Railroad. The original line was an inter-urban traction railroad that ran from Kansas City, KS to Lawrence, KS. The time period is the 1950's and uses steam, diesel, and a gas electric doodlebug. Scenery is 90% complete with 142 ft track, occupying a 32ft x 37ft space.





Gary Davidson's On3 Cedar Gulch & Southern

This layout features the DRGW in Durango, CO. with tracks going Alamosa, CO. and a branch line to Farmington NM. in the fall of the 1940's. The layout is 850 sq ft in two rooms 28ft x 23ft and 18ft x 13ft. It has about 450ft of track on multiple levels. His layout has ten scratch built bridges and trestles and seven tunnels, so far. There are four turntables and the track level varies from 43 to 70 inches. The 18ft x 13ft room has about 90% of scenery complete and the larger room is about 10% complete. Since last showing the upper level on the CG&S to the town of Gaskill has all of the track laid and a logging branch with a switch back to the logging area.







HOME LAYOUT TOURS: continued

Jim Eudaly's O Scale Hinton Division of the Chesapeake & Ohio

The Hinton Division of the C&O is an O Scale layout in a free-standing 35ft x 50ft Butler metal building that is handicapped accessible. It is a walk around design with track heights of 20" at Gauley to 68" at Alleghany. Control is NCE radio. Two dispatchers at a rebuilt US&S CTC machine are used to line the routes and clear signals for the two subdivisions: New River and Alleghany. The layout is fully signaled, fully sceniced, and includes beautiful scratch built structures.





Mike McLain's HO Scale M-K-T Northern Division

Mike models the Missouri-Kansas-Texas Railroad or commonly known as the Katy in the year 1981. The MKT Northern Division encompasses the states of Missouri, Kansas, and Oklahoma. The Katy was a bridge line with Glen Park Yard in Kansas City, KS. Glen Park takes in transfer jobs from the Kansas City staging yard. These transfer jobs could feature the following railroads: ATSF, BN, SSW/SP, UP, CNW, KCS, MILW, and MP. The MKT main line is modeled from Kansas City to Muskogee, Oklahoma. This HO scale layout includes 343ft of track with a 220ft mainline and uses code 70 and 83 track. Scenery is approximately 70% complete.
